Improvisational Quilting



We will focus on improvisational log cabin and half-square triangle blocks. You can use my quilt as inspiration or come with an idea of your own. In either case, you will find that your quilt will take shape as you cut and sew.

Fabric

Bring a variety of fabrics in the colors that you want to work with.

- Fat quarters are a good size to work with.
- Scraps of accent fabric may come in handy.
- There is a fine line between having too much and too little fabric. Bring a variety of colors and values to give you options as you work.

Notions:

- Something suitable for a design wall and a way to hang it.
- A sewing machine in good working order that ***you know how to use***. You don't need your biggest, most expensive machine.
- An extension cord and/or power strip.
- A rotary cutting mat
- 6" x 12" or larger ruler
- A rotary cutter
- Bring suitable thread to use for piecing in color(s) that work with your fabric.
- An iron and pressing mat if it is allowed by the venue.
- Small, sharp fabric scissors
- A portable iron and mat with an extension cord and surge protector. Note that in some venues you may not be able to use your iron.
- A 36" x 36" portable design wall. Note that in some venues you may not be able to pin or tape to the wall.
- Pins for piecing and to use on the design wall.
