Practical Color For Quilters



This is a fun, **no-sew** day filled with surprises and lots of discussion. You will play with color and value as you glue fabric to paper to make pieced blocks. Everyone puts their blocks together and we all get to see what works, what doesn't, and most importantly, how to make color work for you.

This class is suitable for all skill levels.

- Fabric:** Cut 4" x 4" squares of **each** of the following from prints, tone-on-tones, or solids. In any color, you can cut the same fabric, or different fabrics that work together in that color and value. Feel free to include fabric that you are not particularly in love with. Bring more squares if you want to have more choices.
 - 4 squares medium blue
 - 4 squares dark blue
 - 4 squares medium green
 - 4 squares dark green
 - 4 squares light gold
 - 4 squares yellow
 - 4 squares medium orange
 - 4 squares medium red
 - 4 squares dark red
 - 4 squares light pink
 - 4 squares medium purple
 - 8 squares light white or close-to-white

- A **small rotary mat, ruler, and cutter.**
- Paper:** Bring 36 - 4"x4" squares of plain paper. (TIP: You can cut 4 squares per 1 standard sheet of paper.)
- An inexpensive school **glue stick.** You do not need a fancy fabric glue stick
